#### Leviticus 5 (Optional Reading: Leviticus 6-8)

"15 When anyone is unfaithful to the LORD by sinning unintentionally in regard to any of the LORD'S holy things, they are to bring to the LORD as a penalty a ram from the flock, one without defect and of the proper value in silver, according to the sanctuary shekel. It is a guilt offering." (Leviticus 5:15)

Bart turned around to say something to his sister Lisa in class. Immediately, the teacher, Mrs. Simpson, clapped her hands. "I said no talking. You are guilty! Now who will pay for what you have done?" Bart stared in astonishment at his teacher. Pay for talking? With what? Money? A time out? What?

When we do something wrong, we are guilty. That guilt means someone must pay for what was done. Sometimes, the victim of your wrongdoing might offer forgiveness. But in God's eyes, someone still must pay. Why? Because that is the way it works. You do wrong, you pay. You steal money and get caught, you pay. You lie about a situation and get caught, you pay. It is the way the whole world works.

What was God trying to teach the Israelites when he showed them the system of sacrifices and payments? That guilt must be punished.

The joy for us is that Jesus took the punishment that we deserved. When he died on the cross, he paid for the sins of everyone in the world. In other words, God demands payment, and then he paid it through his Son. That is how much he loves us . . . that is how much he loves you.

Lord, may I always remember that you paid that I might be free. Amen
