"30 Then Caleb silenced the people before Moses and said, "We should go up and take possession of the land, for we can certainly do it." (Numbers 13:30 NIV)

Sometimes you will have to stand alone. In the story of the twelve spies in the book of Numbers, we see ten scared men who gave a bad report about the land they had seen. They said the people were powerful. Their cities were fortresses. Some of them, the sons of Anak, were virtual giants. The Israelites could not take the land.

One man stood out, and then another joined him. Caleb assured everyone they could take the land with God's help and Joshua agreed. But in the end, the people did not listen to them. Why? Because they did not have the kind of faith that these two men had.

There will be times when you must stand alone for Jesus. Maybe at work, or school, or church, or neighbors, or even your family. You might be the only Christian in your group of friends. That will bring times when you must speak for the truth even if no one else may agree with you.

All through history, Christians have often stood alone. Two examples are Martin Luther King, Jr., and the person he was named after, Martin Luther, who started the Reformation of the church and changed history too. Many Christians have been persecuted. But they stood firm. Why? Because they had faith in the risen and living God. Faith always gives you courage because God is the source of the faith and strength, and He is with you ... always!

Lord, help me not to be afraid to stand up for what is right. Amen.

RETHINK Stewardship! It's more than monetary giving. Everything we are and have are gifts from God. Be a good steward. Give God back what is His. Not only money, but also time, hands, arms, ears, and mouths.

Ash Wednesday this week. Remember we are dust, and to dust we shall return.

"Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way, the voice of one crying in the wilderness: Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Mark 1:2-3



 $^{f extsf{T}}$ he Lenten season provides a fresh opportunity to reemphasize the value of repentance, and embrace the promised treasures offered to us: God's Holy Word. Christ's Passion and resurrection, and our Baptism into Christ. This year as we journey together toward Easter, the Pastor's Wednesday Bible Study and Midweek Lenten Services will underscore hearing the Gospel, since "faith comes from hearing" (Romans 10:17), while accentuating how the Gospel is conveyed through physical senses of sight, smell, and touch. You will see, touch, smell, and feel each week of Lent: ashes, salt, water, light, bread, and palms. Then, during Holy Week, the focus shifts toward the elements: water and blood (wine), wood, fragrant oil, and finally, milk and honey.

The purpose of focusing on these earthly elements is to make the eternal love of God more

memorable, tactile, and meaningful for you, God's people. These physical elements enable us, who live in an anxious and sinful world, to cling to memorable footholds for renewed hope and comfort as we live in Christ now and await the life to come in heaven.

Early Church Fathers wisely recognized this when their culture opposed the Gospel and when many people did not have the entire written Word of the Bible as we now have. Therefore, much of their teaching utilized common, tangible, and holistic elements to exalt the mysteries of Christ, the Gospel, and faith in the Bible. They would weave biblical narratives and salvation themes with common elements such as ashes, salt, water, light, or bread.
