"¹⁷ I see him, but not now; I behold him, but not near. A star will come out of Jacob; a scepter will rise out of Israel.
He will crush the foreheads of Moab, the skulls of all the people of Sheth." Numbers 24:17

When the wise men were looking for the place where Jesus was born, what brought them there? A star, right?

How had the wise men learned about this special star? Possibly from Daniel, a Jew who served in Babylon as the king's highest adviser. Daniel would have been very familiar with the prophecies in the Old Testament, and he might have told the wise men about a star that would one day announce the birth of the new king of the Jews.

Where could Daniel have gotten this idea of a star? Possibly from Numbers 24:17. There, non-Jewish prophet Balaam talks about a star that would appear when the king arrived.

Some scholars believe that this information was passed down through the centuries from one generation to the next. However, it happened, God made sure that the right people knew the right information at the right time. The wise men saw the star, traveled to Bethlehem, and brought Jesus gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

Isn't it amazing how God works? He never leaves anyone who wants to know about him without the truth. Trust him to bring that truth to your family, your friends, and all the people of the world. For he will.

Jesus, you are the king, and you are my king. I worship you. Amen.
