

"11 And she made a vow, saying, "LORD Almighty, if you will only look on your servant's misery and remember me, and not forget your servant but give her a son, then I will give him to the LORD for all the days of his life, and no razor will ever be used on his head." (1 Samuel 1:11 NIV)

To get what you want, what would you be willing to give up? One summer when we first moved to Virginia, my son was willing to use a chain saw to cut pieces of wood for the fireplace from the trees taken down to build our home. It depends on how much you want it. Many of us will sacrifice something to get what we want.
