

Recognition of Ministry Service for Pastor John Kassouf





"9 The Samaritan woman said to him, "You are a Jew, and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?" (For Jews do not associate with Samaritans.) ¹⁰ Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water." — John 4:9-10 NIV

In this, the longest of Jesus's conversations recorded in Scripture, we find him talking to a Samaritan woman, an outcast. The subject of her "sins" came up. She had five husbands, and the man she was currently with was not her husband. Does Jesus chide her for her sins? Oddly, he does just the opposite. He takes advantage of the fact that she is drawing water from the well and offers her "living water." And what must she do to obtain this living water? *Simply ask.*

Have you had a recent conversation with Jesus about your sins? Have things burdened you that you should not have done? Have you felt remorse over the things you have not done that you should have? The remarkable thing about such conversations with Jesus is that, as with the woman at the well, they result in an invitation from him. That invitation is not to try harder next time or to be yourself up over your sins. Nor must you have a priest or anyone else intercede for you. No, the invitation is far simpler: *Ask Jesus for living water*.

Jesus's well never runs dry, no matter how often we come to him with our failures and regrets.

Jesus was an expert at using questions to pique someone's interest. Over the next few days, concentrate on asking questions of people to see if you can draw them out.

RESULTS OF SPECIAL VOTERS' MEETING ON APRIL 24TH

The second update in our church concerns the special voters' meeting that was held on April 24. The meeting was called to follow up on earlier discussions regarding our current facility at Redeemer Lutheran Church, and whether we should maintain our current facility, consider modifying our facility, or construct an additional building to support our future ministerial goals, as well as enhance our facility for our current ministries.

We discussed the next step in this process, which involves hiring an architectural firm to develop a conceptual design. We agreed that we do not have the technical knowledge within our congregation or staff to render this information. Architectural considerations will consider various options based on a new facility or modifying our existing facility. It will also incorporate Redeemer's needs into the design and what the project may look like when it's completed. This information is essential for our members to make an educated decision. The anticipated cost for these professional services is \$25,000. We were also informed that Redeemer has the funds available to pay for this next step. Approval to move forward with hiring an architectural firm was made with a vote of 54 to one in favor of moving forward.

A future vote will be held after the architectural services are completed to determine whether a site plan will be approved. A building committee is also being established, as well as finding a capital campaign company best suited to assist Redeemer with this project. As we move through this journey, I will try to keep everyone apprised of where we are and where we are going. Most importantly, we must all continue in prayer for God's divine guidance for our staff, council, and congregation as we navigate through the calling process and the prospective growth of our church.

Church Bylaws Pastoral Call Process


Article VI, Section 1.A. in Redeemer's bylaws provides details on calling a new pastor. It states:

When this congregation calls a minister of religion, ordained or commissioned, the following procedure shall be followed:

When a pastor is to be called, every member of the congregation shall be provided opportunity to suggest one or more names for consideration. A call committee shall be appointed [or an existing board or committee designated] to serve as a screening committee and shall submit all suggested names to the district president for information and evaluation. The committee will then present to the congregation by public announcement its proposed list of candidates and their biographical sketches.

At a voters meeting called for the purpose of calling a new pastor or commissioned minister, the proposed list may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the assembly. When possible, information regarding additional candidates shall be provided by the district president and/or his representative at the meeting.

The election of a pastor from the list of candidates chosen shall be held at a subsequent congregational meeting by ballot. The candidate receiving a two-thirds vote of all votes shall be regarded as selected by the congregation. The selection shall, if possible, be made unanimous, and the call shall be sent to the pastor.
