"God's Powerful...We Are Not" (Mark 4:35-41)

Have you noticed? The world is in some stage of transition. Careers are in transition. Families are in transition. Our communities are in transition. Even here within our church family we experience transition: Pastor John and Darlene to retirement, the call to Pastor Bredeson, and now Laura transitioning to an exciting opportunity in Houston, Texas. Transition seems to be everywhere.

There is no doubt that transition is a way of life. To say that we all face transitions is not a revolutionary comment. It just is. Which means that as Christians, we must learn how-to live-in transition, and transitions are not always negative. Salvation, which is transition in God's sight, achieved only by grace, allows God to work in us even during our fear and trembling as Paul put it in Philippians 2:12-13. What does the Christian strive for during transition? Very simply – God's will and God's power to find God's will.

We are powerless over our transitions. The disciples did not know the storm was coming, but they had been through storms before. As fishermen, they have experienced big waves before, and they knew what to do when the weather changed.

But this time was different. They still did not know Jesus that well. Their relationship with Jesus was in transition. But they knew what their outcome was going to be without Jesus. They knew that they were powerless and that the guy sleeping in the boat was powerful. They did not make excuses, but amid their transition, took the first step and called upon Jesus, the Christ. We must admit that we are powerless over transitions. They happen whether we want them to or not.

Transition without God is unmanageable. Once we admit we are powerless, we also need to admit that we cannot go through it alone. Without God, we are alone. We cannot rely on our will exclusively. We cannot expect that amid transition, we have all the answers or the ability to handle each challenge on our own. Proverbs 28:26 says, "He who trusts in himself is a fool, but he who walks in wisdom is kept safe." We need God and his power to help us calm the storm, to give us direction amid apparent indirections. We must admit that transition without God's power is unmanageable.

God has a greater power than we do to make the most of our transitions. Once we accept that transitions happen, that our power is insufficient, and that things become unmanageable without God, we then can move forward together as the family of Christ. In one of the few recorded times when Christ spoke directly to Paul, he said "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in your weakness." (2 Corinthians 12:9)

When we give up our struggle for control and put our lives into God's hands, we find His strength sufficient for any transition in our lives. We need God's power amid transition. God wants to make the most of our transitions.

As we bid farewell, but not good-bye to Laura, who blessed us while here, we remember that throughout Scripture God offers his people, often amid transition, to get it together. And there's only way, one truth, one life in which we can turn to make that happen.

Each time we move through transition with God's help, we prove that God's power is greater than ours, our faith becomes stronger, and we begin to see that God does "work his will and acts according to His purpose."

Let us pray together, Lord, grant each of us strength and discernment amid uncertainty, help us to be honest with ourselves, admitting we need Your mercy and grace, help us to forgive and be forgiven, instill humility and a sense of Your priority, so that we may accept the transition that is before us. Lord may your will be done. Amen.
